FROM THE RECTOR:

As many of you know Andrew is studying for the priesthood in the EMC at the Dallas Theological Seminary. We all wish them the greatest happiness as they begin their married life together in the service of the Lord.

Lent is now in full swing and I hope that everyone is taking it seriously. Along with my preaching series on the beatitudes, you will have the opportunity to take advantage of extra worship services. On Wednesday evenings at 7:00 pm during Lent we will pray the Stations of the Cross to remind us of just what our salvation cost our Savior. To pray the Stations of the Cross meditatively takes some effort. I believe that the version of the Stations that we use (there are dozens of them) allow one to experience the Way of the Cross with the heart as well as the mind and provide the opportunity to get in touch with our sinfulness and sorrow for our sinfulness in a very special way. On Friday evenings at 5:30 pm Fr. Stults will lead Evening Prayer. This is done every Friday of the year not just during Lent.

But if you're looking for another opportunity to worship the Lord during this prayerful and penitential season Evening Prayer on Friday is another possibility. However you choose to observe Lent this year, remember, the goal is to move closer to God. If that is your focus then Lent will be good this year.



The classes for St. Francis children and youth continue each Sunday from 9:30 -10:30 am in the Parish House. We currently have 11 children from the age of 2 to 16 attending class. Thanks is given to the adults who lead or have led a class of the youngest generation in 2007: Bill and Claire Ducker, Jim Crandell, and Julie Rambin.

The teenagers continue to study the lectionary lessons each Sunday. The ensuing discussion always seems to raise some interesting questions for the adult leader as teenagers can have a unique way of discussing the lessons. The children 5th grade and under gather together for Godly Play. They hear the story for each Sunday and with ensuing discussion. Depending on the number of children who attend, they stay together or divide to work on their own activity for the day. Most seem to choose an art or clay project that usually expresses their thoughts on the story. Some choose to hear one of the other stories again. At the end of class, they join together for prayers and a snack. We have been doing these Godly Play lessons since last September and have quite an assortment of lessons and activities relating to the lessons.

As briefly mentioned last month, the children have taken on the project of adopting two active soldiers for the next several months. The plan is for our soldiers to receive a letter from one of the children each month and a care package as often as we can send one. The children could use help with the care packages.
