FROM THE RECTOR:

First of all, may God grant all of you a blessed new year filled with joy and peace. Christmas day is passed but the Christmas season remains for us to celebrate liturgically. I want to thank all who made Christmas a beautiful celebration again this year. Our wonderful volunteers go out of their way to make our worship as beautiful as possible and I am grateful to each and every one of you.

Between Christmas and Epiphany the church begins the new year with the celebration of the Holy Name of Jesus. This may seem a bit strange to us. Not that Jesus' name should not be held in high esteem but that we should have a feast day to celebrate it. The ancients, however, saw much more in a name than we usually do. Names had meaning (I guess some still do) and a person's name was often descriptive of the person's character, personality or in the case of Jesus, his mission. The name, Jesus, means 'the Lord saves'. And so he does. And because Jesus is both Savior and Lord and God his very name is not just descriptive of a personality or mission but rather his very being. In the Magnificat, Mary exclaims "holy is his name." Even though she speaks of the Father she is telling us not something simply about God's character but something about his essence.

It is who God is. Holy, Holy, Holy <u>is</u> the Lord God of hosts. Therefore, just as God's name should never be used in a way that shows disrespect and certainly not to curse, so the name of Jesus requires the same reverence and honor. In the liturgy we bow out of respect for the name of Jesus. Unfortunately, it is not so sometimes in our everyday conversations. If you want to make a resolution for beginning the new year, try to remember that the name of Jesus is always to be worshipped, honored and loved since it represents Jesus himself.

Parish Appreciation Dinner

As we have done for the last few years we will again have a volunteer appreciation dinner for everyone who volunteered for anything in the parish during calendar year 2009. As I have said in the past I am not going to be the arbiter of whether or not you fall into that category. You will have to make that decision yourself. I have no details yet since I have not made any arrangements for the party. I intend for it to be on Saturday evening, January 23. So try to hold that date open. More details will follow soon and a signup sheet will appear in the parish hall. You must sign up to be included in the festivities.

Children's and Youth Christian Education

I cannot help but to report with pride on the excellent job the children did with their performance of the Christmas Pageant on December 20. All the elementary aged children in the Sunday school class, as well as those usually in the nursery joined with the teens to present an admittedly ambitious pageant that spanned from Advent to Epiphany. I am particularly proud of the three cast members who were able to memorize and read lines. Most had several roles to play and they handled the costume changes with adeptness.

Classes are currently on break and will pick up again January 10. The elementary aged class will begin a study of New Testament stories. First we will discuss Epiphany in the broader sense that Jesus was the savior of the whole world. The next lessons will be on how having Christ in the home leads us to being a part of the family of God followed by a lesson on how we should follow Christ's example and be a servant to each other and to God. The last Sunday of the month begins our Pre-Lent season with a lesson on how Peter learns to forgive.

The teen class decided that the Bible study worked well. They will begin the new year by studying the book of Romans in the same Life Change Series. Mike Ready is willing and able to lead the class once again, as Ellen is interested in pursuing other interests, like college. Thanks Ellen for working with the class this past semester.
