FROM THE RECTOR:

EASTER 2010

This year April begins with the Easter Triduum and Easter itself. For those of you who do not know the schedule for Holy Week, here it is. Maundy Thursday is April 1. We will have the Holy Communion service followed by the stripping of the altar beginning at 7:00 pm. This service commemorates the institution of the Eucharist and in one sense the "ordination" of the apostles to whom Jesus gave the command "Do this in memory of me."

The service for Good Friday also begins at 7:00 pm. (There will be no Evening Prayer or Games Night on this day). This service calls to mind Jesus' passion and death and includes the Solemn Collects and other prayers for the church. It also includes the veneration of the cross, the instrument of Jesus' death as well as our salvation.

The Solemn Easter Vigil will take place on Saturday, April 3, at 7:30 pm. It should take place much later but none of you would come if it did. Everyone should participate in this magnificent celebration. I think that those of you who have will attest to beauty and solemnity of this liturgy. It contains the first proclamation of the resurrection of Our Lord and readings from the Scriptures that

speak to us of the history of our salvation. It is also the first Mass of Easter.

Of course, we will have our regular Sunday schedule on Easter Sunday morning, Holy Communion at 9:30 and 11:00 am. At the 11:00 o'clock service the children of the parish will also do the flowering of the cross. It is my hope that many of you will attend all or at least some of these Holy Week services. It's only once a year and these services help us to meditate upon the most important mysteries of our faith. They should not be missed.

A special word of thanks is due to our Presiding Bishop, William W. Millsaps, for joining us the weekend of March 13/14 for the ordination to the priesthood of Father Andrew Brummett and Father Tim Williams. He also confirmed Jessica Brummett, Eleanore Douglas, Becky Hunt and Polly Sowell. Our congratulations to both the ordinands and confirmands. To my knowledge, Tim and Andrew are the first priests to be ordained in our church. This was truly a momentous occasion.

None of this could have been done without the help of so many people. I want to thank everyone who had anything to do with the preparation and execution of the
