

FROM THE RECTOR:

Well, it's official! At the parish meeting on March 17, the congregation voted to accept the recommendation of the Facilities Committee and the Vestry to move the location of our worship space to Research Square, 10435 Burnet Road, Suite 125. From my observation, the vote was nearly unanimous and there was an aura of excitement in the room as we discussed the next step in the future of our parish.

This has been quite some time in coming. There were several factors that made this transition difficult and lengthy. But the committee has been diligently searching for and evaluating the properties that have come to its attention and I want to thank the members of the committee and especially Mark Rambin for work above and beyond the call of duty.

For those of you who were not at the meeting, there is one point that needs to be stressed. This is a temporary location for us. Obviously, it would have been optimal for us to move from one location to another permanently. That just wasn't possible at this time. We are still searching for what will be our permanent home. The Research Square facility will provide us with the kind of space we need to continue our work of evangelization in the Austin area until such a time as we can either find another church or build one to suit our needs on a piece of property. Incidentally, we are currently evaluating a piece of property in Northwest Austin to see if that land might be suitable for our permanent use. That evaluation could be complete by the time you read this and we may know if we can proceed with the purchase of that land.

Times like these are often tinged with a little bit of anxiety as well as excitement. But I was impressed

on Sunday with the enthusiasm in the congregation. We now have to translate that enthusiasm into a bit of hard work to make the transition. I will be asking some of you to work with me as we put a transition committee together and I will welcome anyone who wishes to help with the move. Usually, after Easter, there is a big sigh and a bit of a respite. Not this year. In fact, we will have to get moving on the moving project. For those of you who are in charge of ministries at the parish, I would encourage you to begin taking inventory of what we have and what we will need to take with us. This is a great time for house cleaning and getting rid of that which is no longer needed. If you haven't used it in a year or don't know what it's for, we might not need it. Just a thought. At any rate we will need all the help we can get so I ask that you make yourself as available as you can during April. Our last Sunday service at the current location will be on Sunday, April 28. On Sunday, May 5, we will have our first service in the new, temporary facility.

I know as I write this that Holy Week and Easter are yet a few days away. However, I also know that so many people make these celebrations extraordinary each year and I want to thank all of you who work behind the scenes as well as those who actually participate in the execution of these beautiful liturgical celebrations. I know that God is well pleased with our efforts in that regard and that He will bless you for your faithfulness.
