FROM THE RECTOR

I hope that you all had a Blessed and Happy Christmas and that the coming year will be a prosperous one.

As is always the case, our Christmas celebrations were wonderful. The church looked great, the music was excellent and we had a good number of folks, both parishioners and visitors, who worshipped with us on Christmas Eve and Christmas morning. I want to thank everyone who made these celebrations possible. There is much preparation on the part of a number of people in order to make these things happen and I am grateful to them all.

There are a few things coming up in January both for the diocese and our parish that will be transitions. First of all, Bishop Ryan Reed will become the Fourth Bishop of Fort Worth at midnight, January 1, 2020. Bishop Iker celebrated his last public Mass on Christmas Eve at St. Vincent's Cathedral. Bishop Reed will be installed formally at the cathedral on Sunday, January 5, at a Solemn Evening Prayer service at 6:00 pm. This is not quite as big an occasion as was his consecration back in September, but Solemn Evening Prayer is beautiful and quite impressive in its own right. There will be a reception following the installation. One interesting item with regard to the installation is that Bishop Iker will present to Bishop Reed the crozier (bishop's staff) used by Bishop A. Donald Davies, the First Bishop of Fort Worth. It is more of a symbolic gesture but a somewhat meaningful one nonetheless.

More locally, we will have our annual parish meeting on Sunday, January 19, following the 11:00 am Holy Communion service. There will be the usual reports from the Senior Warden, the Treasurer, and of course the Rector. More importantly, we will have an election for two new Vestry members to replace Dinah Arce and Missy Bernard, whose terms are expiring. Dinah has served as our Vestry Secretary, Chair of the parish's Audit Committee and alternate delegate to the diocesan convention. Missy takes care of our Sunday School and nursery and has also served on our Audit Committee.

Four of your fellow parishioners have expressed a willingness to stand for election for a three year term. They are Christina Hatley, Libby Ibañez, David Norris, and Bill Palmer. In the days ahead, I will get out some information on these prospective Vestry members so that you may choose wisely at the meeting. If you have ever served on a Vestry, you know how important these positions are. I am grateful to all of these folks for their willingness to be a part of the leadership of the parish. I hope that you all are as well.

January is Pro-Life month in the United States because of the Roe v. Wade decision of the Supreme Court, issued on January 22, 1973. This year we will observe Pro-Life Sunday on January 12 because of our parish meeting on the 19th. While we have made strides in combating the evil of abortion over the years, our opponents who have lost the ground have become more strident in their attacks on life. After all, it is costing them money. It's a threat to their livelihood. While the task may seem impossible at times, progress is being made. Never forget that our God is a God of the impossible. Many people who have been in the abortion industry have left the killing business and become pro-life advocates. There are a number of things going on this month and I'm sure that they will be discussed later in this newsletter. Never lose heart.

ANGLICANS FOR LIFE

As we approach "**Pro-Life Sunday**" on January 12, it is a good time to reflect on what that represents. All life is a gift given by God. It is precious, no matter the age, economic circumstances, ethnicity, or disability. We are all of equal value in the eyes of God. Our mission is to stand up and protect the lives of the vulnerable, the unborn, the infirm, and the elderly. Here at St. Francis, we actively strive to fulfill that mission both individually and through various ministries including the Anglicans For Life ministry.

On the second Sunday of each month, there is a *Worship and Hymn Sing* from 3:30 - 4:30 p.m. at the Retirement and Nursing Center on Burnet Lane. There is the *St. Claire's Guild* that provides meals for our parish families in times of celebration, need, illness, or loss. The Sunday School prepares Christmas boxes for children in need through *Samaritan's Purse*. Several parishioners provide transportation to and from church for services and activities for those who otherwise would be unable to attend. The *Prayer Shawl Ministry* provides shawls to people who are in need of comfort and prayer.

Our Anglicans for Life ministry has focused on the unborn. We do that through participating in the 40 Days for Life prayer campaigns in the fall and spring. We support Trotter House, a pregnancy resource center next to the UT campus, through baby supply drives; attending their annual fund raising banquet; and, at Christmas time, "adopting" a family in need. This year, we will be hosting a baby shower for them. Coming up on Saturday January 25th, we will be participating in the **Rally for Life** here at the Texas State Capitol. The next Anglicans for Life meeting will be after the 11:00 service on January 12th. Please consider St. supporting Francis's pro-life commitment by participating in one or more of these ministries and their activities.


Join us Jan 30—Feb 2, 2020


